

Agnes Ravatn is a Norwegian author celebrated for her sharp psychological insight and elegant, suspenseful prose. Her breakthrough novel The *Bird Tribunal* (2013) became an international bestseller, sold to 21 countries, and was later adapted into a successful stage play.
